

the authorization form and hand it to their supervisor, who will forward it to the Payroll Department. While there will be no personal solicitation, employees are urged to read the materials and to consider the advantages of regular saving through the Payroll Plan.

Series E bonds can be bought in eight convenient denominations. Under the Payroll Savings Plan, the purchaser designates the amount he wishes deducted from his pay each payday. When these savings equal the cost of a bond of the chosen denomination, the bond is issued and sent to the purchaser.

The United States Treasury Depart-

ment protects the bond buyer against loss of principal or interest and guarantees that the interest rate will never go down during the life of the Savings Bond. (It has gone up several times since 1941.) For safety, a microfilm record is made of each Bond in the event replacement is ever needed. A Savings Bond carries an absolute guarantee of replacement if lost, destroyed or stolen.

At the option of the owner, Savings Bonds may be redeemed any time after two months from the issue date, without advance notice. Since practically all banks are agents of the U. S. Treasury, the bonds may be cashed just about anywhere in the United States.
