

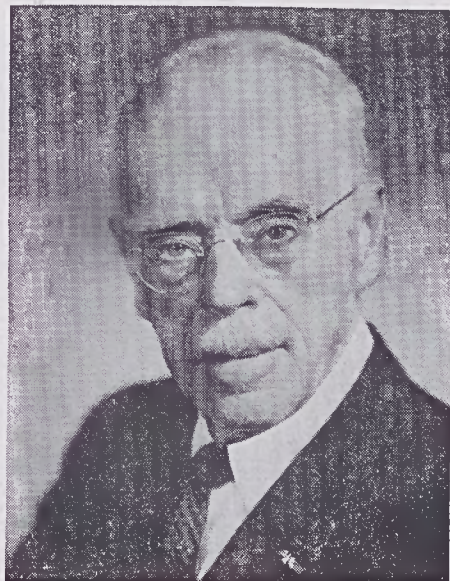
Dr. Paul Dudley White To Give Talk Here

Paul Dudley White, M.D., world renowned heart specialist, will be guest speaker at the "Hearts and Husbands" program being sponsored by the Rockingham County Heart Association.

Dr. White is remembered by many as the attending physician to former President Dwight Eisenhower when he suffered a coronary thrombosis in 1955.

Dr. White, a founder of the American Heart Association, is president of the International Society of Cardiology and its research branch, the International Society of Cardiology Foundation. He received his A.B. and M.D. degrees at Harvard University, and is now clinical professor of medicine, Emeritus, there. He is also consultant in medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital where he interned and was resident.

Dr. White has also served as consultant to the Surgeons General of the U. S. Army and Navy Veterans' Administration. Among the awards he has received are The French Legion of Honor, Distinguished Service Medal of the American Medical Association, Czech Order of the White Lion and the Gold Heart, Albert Lasker and Howard W.

Dr. White is a member of medical and cardiological societies in England, France, Czechoslovakia, Mexico, Brazil and Argentina. He holds honorary degrees in many leading universities throughout the world.

The program is designed to teach wives what they can do to reduce their husband's chance of having a heart attack. It will be presented Saturday, January 18, at the Morehead High School auditorium from 3:30 to 5 p.m., with no admission charge.

The welcome will be made by Earl W. Vaughn, Speaker of the North Carolina House of Representatives. Also appearing on the program will be Dr. Walter Floyd, Duke University heart specialist, and Dr. Ernest Craig, UNC heart specialist.
