The jacket describes the book as "intended to provide supervisors and foremen with better means of improving safety by training them in the analysis and correction of the causes of unsafe acts".

Written in two parts, the first part of the book deals with the role of the supervisor in training, motivating and correcting. The second part presents a series of realistic case studies designed for role-playing.
