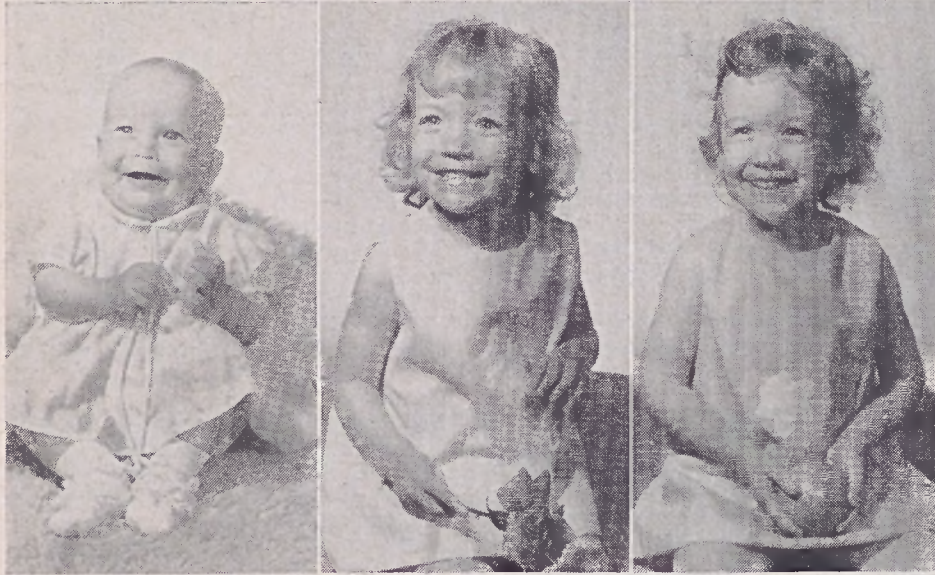


Kelly, Kathy And Kris Joyce

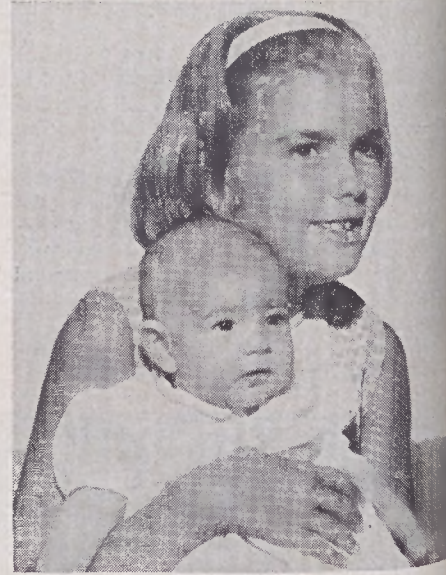
