

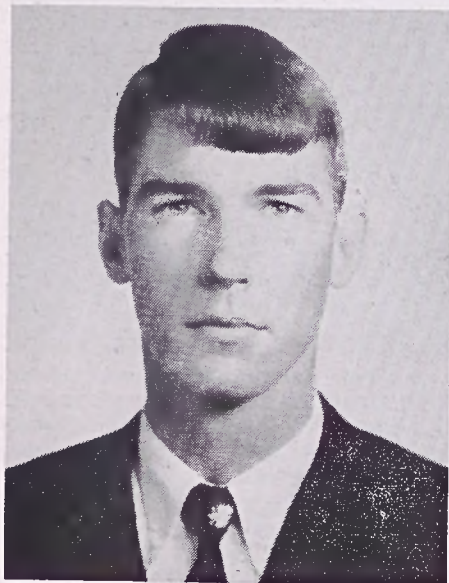
Employees' Children Get College Degrees

If any forms are turned in with the co-makers signatures in pencil, these will be returned to the makers, which will delay the loan. The Credit Union urges everyone to pay particular attention to this rule so that loans will not be held up by applications having to be returned.

This requirement that all co-makers sign in ink is the only new rule in applying for a loan. The process for applying for a loan remains the same in all other ways.
