"We cannot expect the textile industry and its stockholders to risk their money in new plants and some of the dramatic new processes we have seen in recent years when their efforts are going to be continually undercut by low-wage imports.

It is most discouraging for a company to develop a new product, build a modern plant to make the product, train its employees in new techniques, and then find it must compete with goods which are identical except for one thing.

They sell for a few cents less because they were made by people earning 37 cents or less an hour rather than the \$2 an hour the American textile industry pays." — Sen. Herman E. Talmadge (D-Ga.)
