## Appointed Foreman

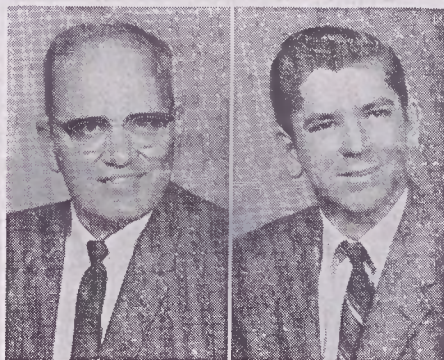
