Fieldale Employees Served By New Personnel Building

The new Personnel Building at the Fieldale Towel Mill at Fieldale, Va., provides modern facilities for employment and personnel procedures. The new building, occupied December 1, 1969, replaced the former Personnel Building which burned in March, 1969.

Situated in an attractive setting facing southeast on Marshall Way as one enters the town of Fieldale from the

east, the handsome building contain over 4,000 square feet of floor space.

Facilities provided include a lobble waiting room, personnel offices, employees store, storage rooms, conference room and medical department.
