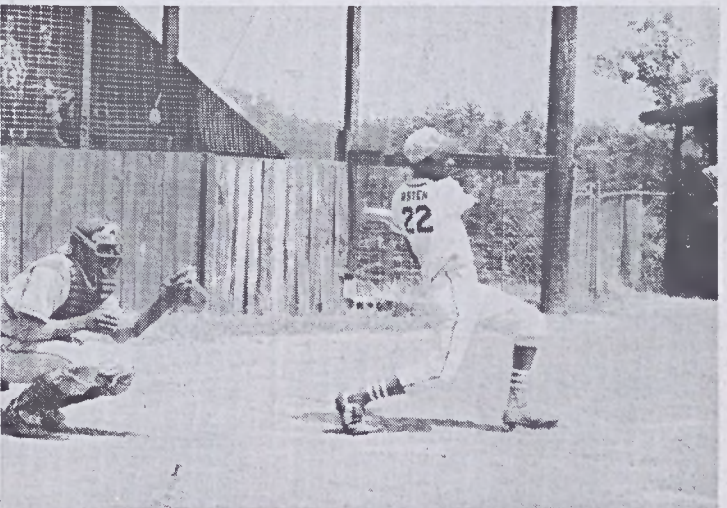


Bedspread Finishing Man Manages Shiloh Eagles

The Shiloh Eagles won two and lost one of their last three games. They defeated Pine Hall 13-6, the Winston-Salem Indians 9-4 and lost a close one to Horse Pasture 8-7. They now have a season record of 19 wins and 13 losses.

The Eagles, managed by Sam Broadnax, of the Bedspread Finishing Mill, were to play a return game with the Winston-Salem Indians on July 25.

On August 30 they will travel by bus to Richmond for a game with the Richmond Braves. Interested fans can obtain seats on the bus by contacting the team manager, or any of the players by August 1. The fare will be \$5, round-trip.

The Eagles first started playing together several years ago in a pasture near Eagle Falls. Their opponents were mainly teams from nearby communities.

In 1967 the team got together and asked Sam Broadnax, who had played with them occasionally, to be their manager. Since that time they have had progressively more and more active seasons.

Manager Broadnax says he has no trouble finding teams to play. There are usually other managers at the Eagles' games, scouting for opponents and "it looks like they all want to beat us."
