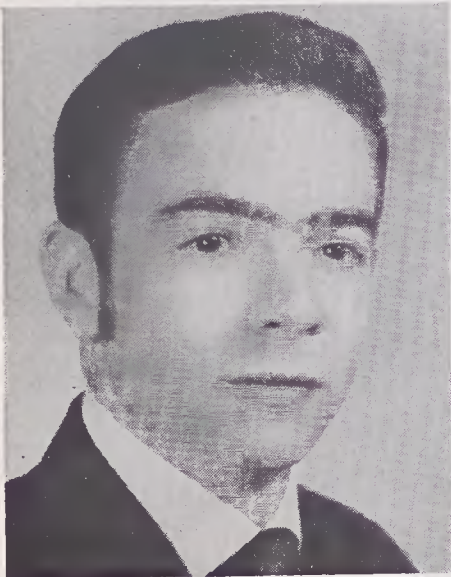


Grandson Of Retirees Becomes Veterinarian
