The budget-goal in the community-Wide campaign represents the minimum amount needed for the continuance of he l1 health, welfare, and recreational ¹¹ health, weitare, and the renvices included in the campaign.

The board of directors of the Eden United Fund approved the over-all budset recommended by the budget and adhissions committee. Included is an \$12.403.20, amount for contingencies, \$12,403.20, NDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 1970

designed to cover shrinkage due to persons moving away or otherwise defaulting on their pledges, and to provide a slight reserve for the future.

The budget-goal of \$125,000 is an increase over last year's goal of \$105.000. due mainly to the increasing costs of operation of the participating organizations and in some instances to increased services and programs being offered.

The Eden United Fund agencies and the amount allotted to each for the 1971 budget year are as follows: Boys Club, \$14,110.33; Boy Scouts, \$14,300; Girl

Scouts, \$5,141; Red Cross, \$11,368.34; Rescue Squad, \$5,654; Retarded Children, \$2,500; Salvation Army, \$7,169; YMCA's (Central, Draper and Henry Street), \$45,000; Carolinas United, \$7,-354.13; and contingencies, \$12,403.20.

William L. Atkinson, of Leaksville Bank and Trust Company, is president of the Eden United Fund; Charles Nooe, a local attorney, is general chairman of the community-wide fund campaign; and Lyman A. Collins, of Southern National Bank, is chairman of the budget and admissions committee.
