Lawless Gets Columbus Cup Award

The Columbus Cup is given annually in recognition of exceptional performance in all aspects of account relationships. Foremost among the considerations is Columbus towel volume and the percentage of sales increase over the previous year's volume. In 1970, Mr.

Lawless was responsible for a 165% increase over the previous year.

First to win the Columbus Cup in 1966 was David Duncan, followed by Joseph R. Kinnier, Robert K. McGee, Owen C. Due, J. B. Ralph, William A. Barrett and Albert F. Serocke.

Mr. Lawless joined Fieldcrest in 1947 and through the years has been active in many areas of the marketing division. In 1966 he was appointed manager, military and distributor sales, the position he now holds. He and his family make their home in Freeport, L. I.
