Wiggonton New Plant Manager, Alexander

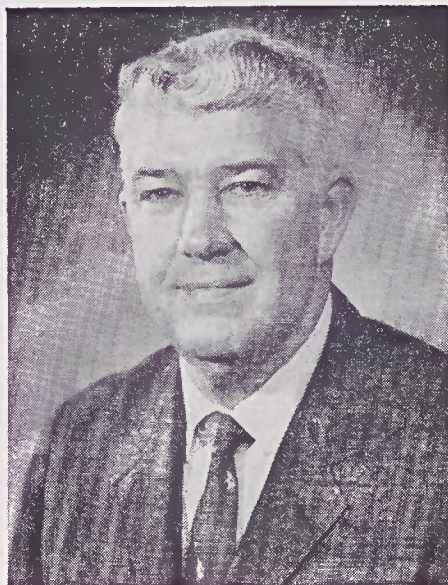
