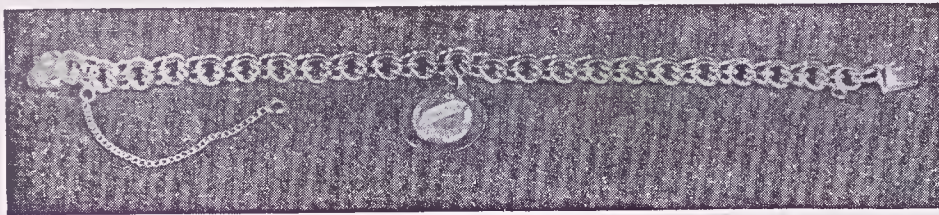


Service Emblem Used For Charm Bracelet
