First Aid In Accident Cases Emphasized In Course Given Attendants And Supervisors

A four-hour first aid course developed through the Medical, Safety and Training Departments was taught in the Bedspread Mill conference room for 12 employees of the Bedspread Mill.

It was given in two sessions on September 8 and 9, for employees of the second and third shifts. A similar course for first shift employees is to be scheduled in October.

Lloyd Bolt, medical technician in the Medical Department, was instructor for the course. Mr. Bolt has had standard and advanced courses in first aid as well as instructor training.

The course was designed to enable supervisors and first aid attendants to render first aid in an accident resulting in injury until the injured person can be taken to the Medical Department or to a hospital.
