Roy Beach, a mechanical engineer in the central Engineering Department at Eden, has been registered in North Carolina as a professional engineer. He already was registered in South Carolina where he worked before joining Fieldcrest in April 1971.

Such registration means that he is licensed to practice engineering within the state and to use the title of engineer.

The requirements for becoming a registered professional engineer are a bachelor's degree in engineering, four years of progressive experience in engineering work of a nature and at a level approved by the Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors, and the successful completion of a written examination given by the Board.

Mr. Beach, a native of Alabama, attended Auburn University and received his B. S. degree in engineering from the University of Alabama. He did engineering work for several firms in Alabama and was with Owens Corning Fiberglas Corp. in Aiken, S. C. immediately before joining Fieldcrest.
