12 Years Old

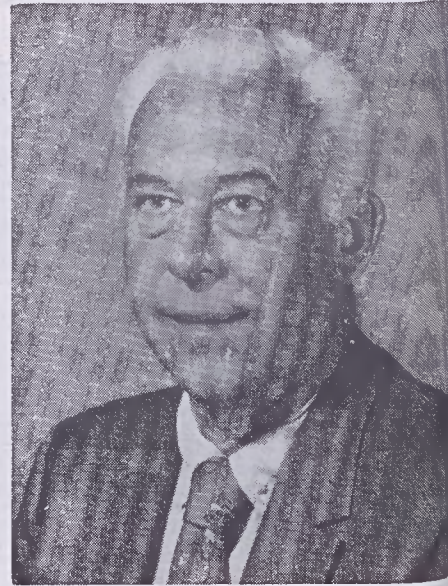
