competitive bidding in early February with the hope that construction can begin in late March or early April, according to Dr. L. H. Hance, vice president of Research and Engineering. Approximately nine to twelve months will be required for completion, he said.

"The firm of A. G. Odell, designers of the new building, is one of the outstanding architectural firms in the design of facilities of this type and was selected to provide an outstanding addition to the General Office complex as well as to provide an architectural structure of significant beauty," Dr. Hance said.

The new building will house Field-

crest's Technical Services Department, which includes Research, Domestic Product Development, and Domestic Quality Control. The new facility has been designed to accommodate approximately sixty to eighty persons.

The upper level of the building will house the Technical Services Department, a technical library, conference room and laboratories. The lower level will include development laboratories, storage areas and space for future ex-

pansion.

"The present headquarters of the Technical Services Department is completely inadequate for our present needs. This facility will be the culmination of several years of planning to provide facilities which will indicate the importance of Research and Development in the total merchandising and manufacturing thrust of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc. in the marketplace," Dr. Hance said.
