In addition, Mr. Battle stated that fourth quarter results were unfavorably affected by the disposition of substantial quantities of off-quality or obsolete merchandise.

Mr. Battle further stated that the current unfilled order position is 21% higher than the previous year and at a record level. "The favorable order position along with the strong retail business climate and price increases which have gone into effect lead us to be optimistic about the prospects for 1973," he said.
