## Promotions Announced

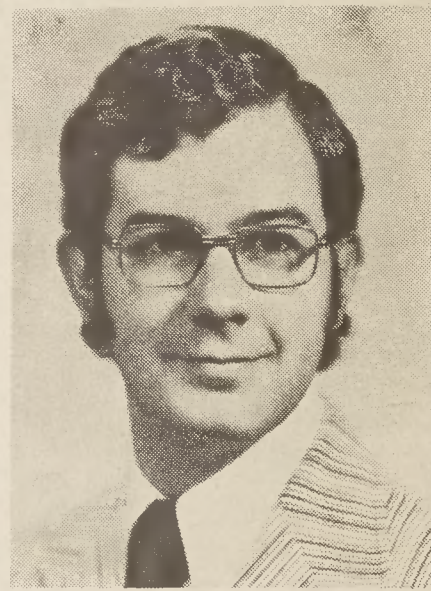


OSCAR O. TUCKER

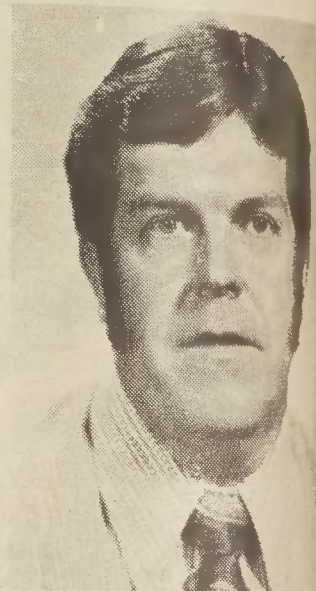

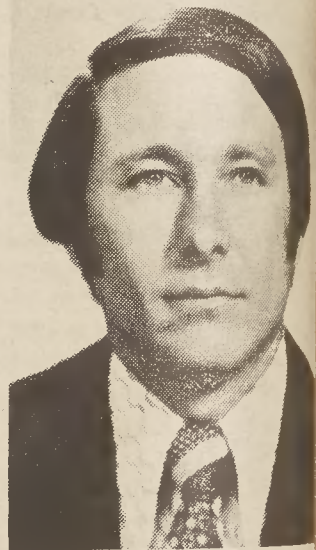

Gray Hundley, Karastan Plant Services, holds the Lynrock Golf Club championship trophy which he won on November 4.

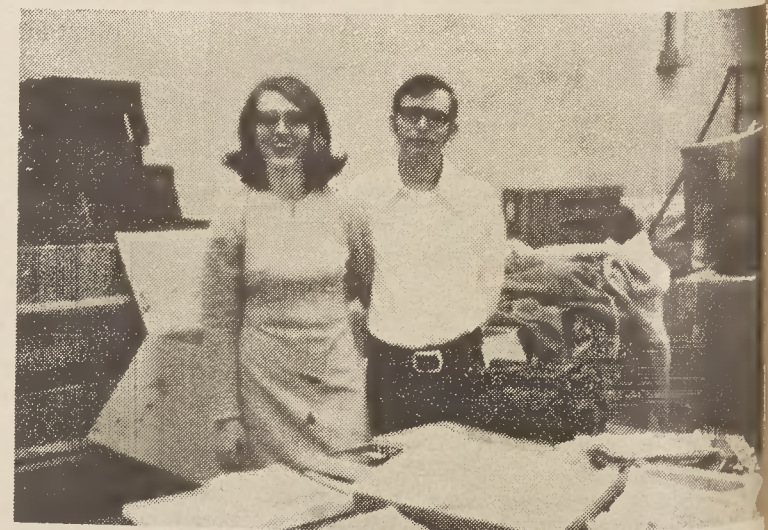
Mr. Hundley defeated Willie Talbott in the championship flight 3 and 2.
