

The banjo player is Bob Fuhr, a native of Long Island who became interested in the banjo at the age of 15 when he inherited one from an aunt. He plays several instruments, has studied voice and has spent two years doing summer-fall-winter-and-spring stock. He also has played in clubs across the country.




William Suworoff will demonstrate the art of pottery at the Craftsfair.
