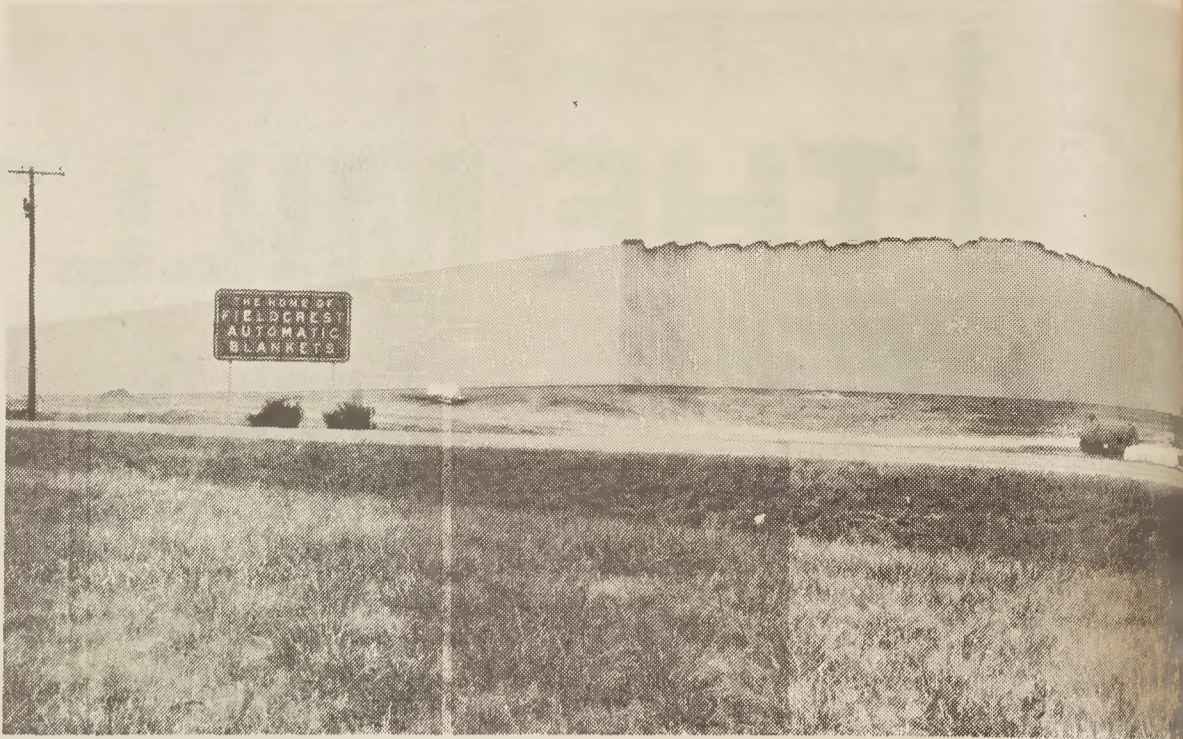

# New Warehouse At Smithfield

A 76,000 square-foot warehouse has been completed at the Automatic Blanket Plant at Smithfield.

The new facility, which was constructed on the north side of the Automatic Blanket plant, measures 180 feet wide and 425 feet long.

"The new warehouse will eliminate the necessity for the company's renting warehouse

space in Smithfield and Pine level," said T. R. Wallace, plant manager.

"The automatic blanket business is a highly seasonal one, with about 60 percent of the goods being shipped in the last four months of the year. This new addition should meet our requirements for the next several years," he said.

Goods will be moved into the new warehouse during

December, Mr. Wallace said. Fieldcrest began operating Smithfield in June of 1960 with 209,000 square-foot facility. Several years ago, an additional 100,000 square feet of floor space was added. The latest addition makes a total of 385,000 square feet in the automatic blanket operation.

The new facility was built by Rogers Construction Company of Smithfield.

**A.** Federal gift tax returns are not filed annually. They are filed quarterly. If you give gifts to any one person, you must file a return for each gift added to all previous gifts to that person during the year.

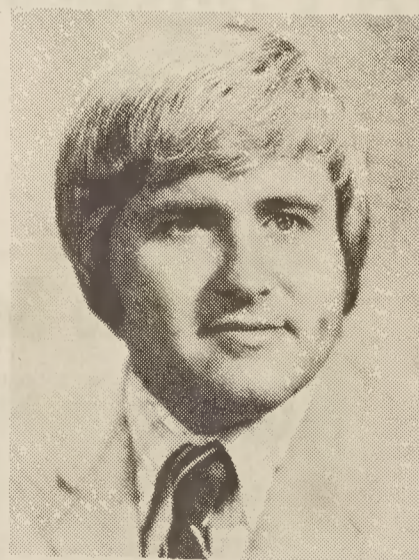
## Draper Parade Is December 14
