

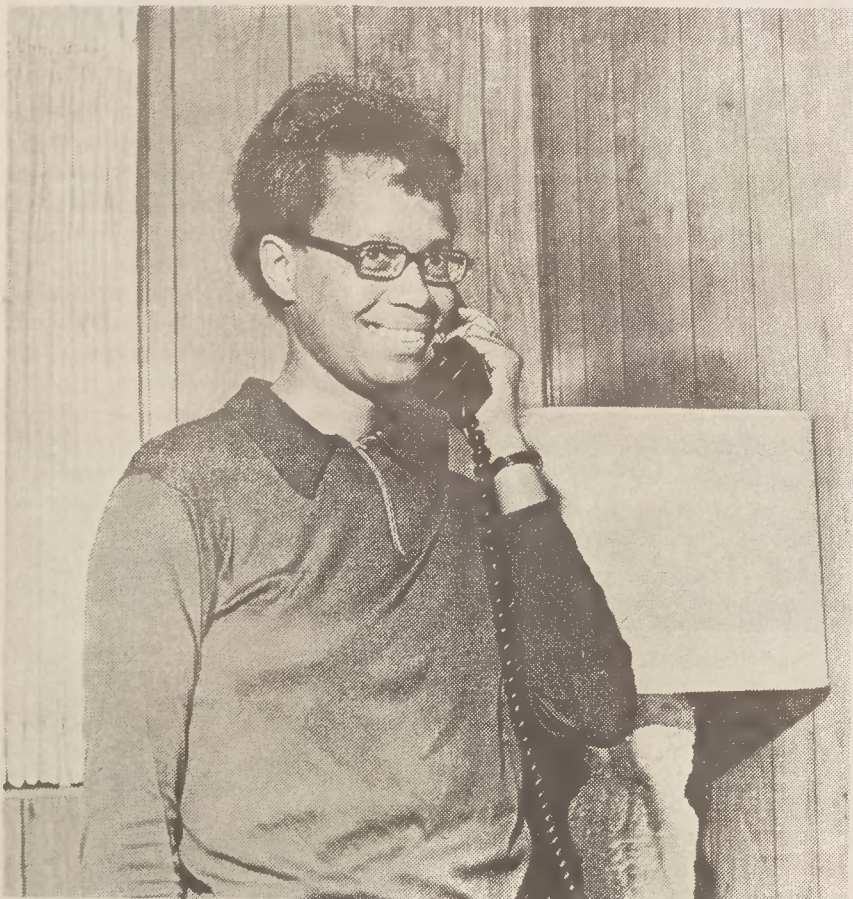

Employee At Fielddale Is Winner Of \$176 Jackpot

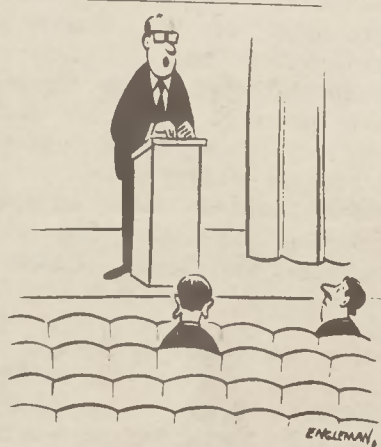
