In the drawing among Fair Share givers, Douglas Joseph, mill man, was the winner of the television set.

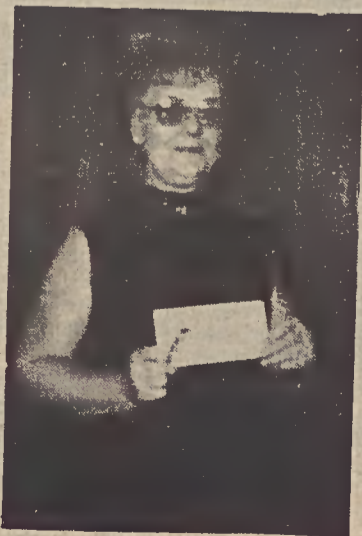
