ee Local Social Security Office or SS Income After Retirement

For the last two years, all included an Employee Benefits attement containing, among other formation, an estimate of Social ecurity benefits. The response has every favorable. People find the attements, including the Social ecurity estimates, very useful.

For most of us, the Social Security stimates will be quite accurate. However, for any employee with trnings which have varied widely who has had covered earnings in any employmment other than with

Fieldcrest, the Social Security estimate will not be accurate even though it is the best estimate that we can get using the information and the system that we have available.

All employees considering retirement and particularly those age 61 or older, are encouraged by Fieldcrest and the Social Security Administration to visit their local Social Security Office several years prior to retirement in order to get official information about the income anticipated from Social Security.

In an evening of athletic frolicking and family fun, several hundred Fieldcrest employees participated in the first Fieldcrest Olympics at the Eden YMCA on May 1.
