Six Seniors "Practice Teach" For One Week In Public Schools

Six members of this year's graduating class, under the direction of Professor John Miller, are meeting the requirements to teach in the public schools of the various states. In addition to taking a number of hours in such subjects as psychology, secondary education, materials, methods, and mental hygiene, these girls are required to spend at least forty-five hours observing in the high schools, and forty-five hours of actual teaching, or a total of ninety hours of both.

Most of the girls already have more than the required number of hours of observation. Some of the schools in which they observed were Lee Edwards High School in Asheville, the Newton Grade School in Asheville, Swannanoa High School, Black Mountain Grade School, Black Mountain High School, Montreat High School, and the Parker District Schools of Greenville, South Carolina.

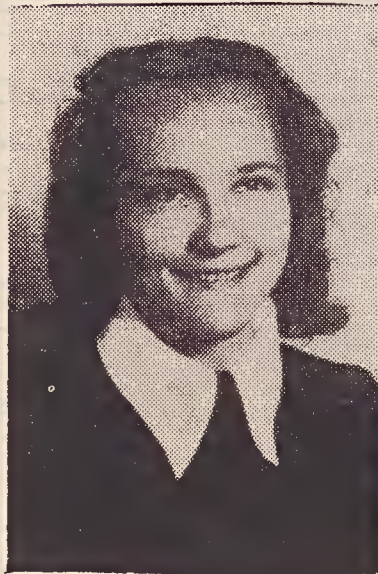
The show will begin at 8 o'clock, and admission will be fifteen cents.

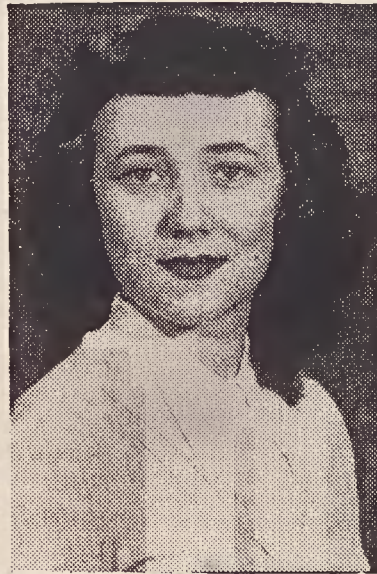

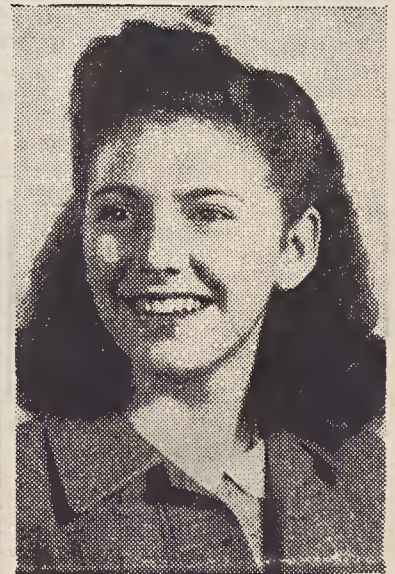
