DAVIDSON-The \$2,500,000 Davidson College Development program will open in the Western North Carolina area, including Black Mountain with a "Davidson Dinner" in Asheville, Thursday, Dec. 1.

All alumni, parents and friends of the college are invited to attend the dinner meeting at the Battery Park Hotel at 6:30 p. m. There will be no charge for the dinner and no solicitation will be made. Ladies are also invited.

Included on the program will be an address by Dr. John A. Cunningham president of Davidson, and a showing of a sound-color movie made on the campus.

The national Davidson program has secured \$1,970,000 toward the \$2,500,000 goal. The money will be used for a new gymnasium, church student center, dormitory, fine arts quadrangle and for a \$1,000,-000 addition to the college endowment.


