### CHOIR CONCERT WILL CLOSE PROGRAM

"O Rejoice Ye Christians Loudly" - Bach; "Lo How A Rose E'er Blooming" - Praetorius; "What A Wonder" - A Lithuanian Folk Song; "Shepherds on This Hill" - A Greek Folk Song; "Rejoice All Men" - John Jacob Niles.

After Mirta Borges has sung a solo, "A Star Was His Candle," a carol written by Teresa del Riego, the Inner Choir will sing:

"While By My Sheep" - 17th Century Christmas Hymn; "The Sleep of the Child Jesus" - Gevaert; "From Heaven High The Angels Came" - Traditional; "Whence Come Ye" - Italian Folk Song.

The program will close with excerpts from Handel's MESSIAH. Included will be several solos by Charlotte Roth, Catherine Byrum, and Pat Woody; and the entire choir will sing the Hallelujah Chorus.

The choir will be accompanied by Miss Ann Arthur.
