Dr. Albert C. Holt Comes From Florida

Dr. Albert C. Holt, of Jacksonville, Florida, has become Academic Dean of Montreat College.

Dr. Holt received his A.B. and A.M. degrees from Park College, Kansas City, Missouri, and attended McCormick Seminary, Chicago. He did graduate work at the University of Chicago, University of Southern California, Vanderbilt University and Peabody College, and was listed in "Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities" in each of these. He received his Ph.D. degree from Vanderbilt and Peabody, and his D.D. degree from Tusculum College. Along with his educational career, Dr. Holt has taken an active part in the ministry. He has served as pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Jacksonville for the past 25 years, and was also assistant pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Nashville.

His duties at Montreat College as dean will not be a new experience, for he served as dean of Tusculum College for seventeen years. During his busy life Dr. Holt has found time to travel and study in Canada, Cuba, Mexico, England, and Scotland.

Dr. and Mrs. Holt plan to make their home in Montreat where they have spent their vacations for the past 20 years.

Mr. Frantz

Mr. Harold M. Frantz, a native of Pennsylvania, is head of the music department and teacher of organ, piano, and theory. A graduate of Marshall and Franklin College, in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, Mr. Frantz has received a Master of Sacred Music from the Union Theological Seminary of New York, and a Master of Music from Westminster Choir College. He has taught at Middleburg College in Vermont, at Davidson College for the past three years, and has been a minister of music at several churches. In his spare time Mr. Frantz composes for the organ and for a string quartet.
