Jewish Leader Will Lecture Students

Rabbi Meyer H. Marx, spiritual leader of Temple Beth El in Knoxville, Tennessee, will give a lecture to the student body December 5, 8:00 p.m., in Gaither Chapel. His topic is "What Every Christian Should Know About Judaism". This is an official college function.

Rabbi Marx was educated at the University of Cinninnati and Howard College in Birmingham, Alabama. He was ordained a rabbi by Hebrew Union-Jewish Institute of Religion in 1938.

The rabbi, who has had articles published in the Synagogue, New Orleans Jewish Leader, Pulpit Digest, and in the National Jewish Post, is presently serving as spiritual leader of Temple Beth El in Knoxville. Prior to this he served congregations in Mississippi, Nebraska, Illinois and Alabama.

At the present time Rabbi Marx is visiting lecturer in Judaism in the School of Religion at the University of Tennessee and is Hillel Counselor to the Jewish students at the University.

The National Federation of Temple Brotherhoods sponsors the Jewish Chautauqua Society, an organization which creates better understanding of Jews and Judaism through education.

After Rabbi Marx's lecture a coffee hour will be sponsored by the CCUN.
