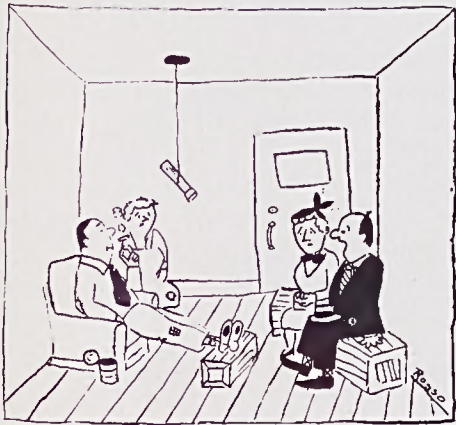


# Co-Eds Fall To Western Carolina, 59-29
