

Commencement Exercises May 29

On Monday, May 29, 1961, the refrain of "Children of the King" will again be heard in Gaither Chapel, for it is on that date that thirty Sophomores will receive their associate degrees from Montreat-Anderson College. The Reverend Joseph B. Clower, Jr., Doctor of Theology and Professor of Bible at Hampden-Sydney College, Hampden-Sydney, Virginia, will bring to a close three days of precommencement activities.

The annual awards ceremony will be at eleven o'clock a.m. on Saturday, May 27. At that time those students who have done outstanding work in the areas of scholarship and athletics will be recognized.

The Reverend J. Wayte Fulton, Jr., D.D., Pastor of Shennandoah Presbyterian Church in Miami, Florida, will deliver the Baccalaureate Sermon at 10:45 a.m., May 28. A communion service at 7:45 Sunday evening will complete the activities.
