WHY A COLLEGE HERE?

In 1913 a great many members of the Mountain Reatreat Association felt that the property and facilities were being wasted during the winter season. That year they approved the formation of a two-year woman's college.

In October of 1914, the school opened its first session with eight female students, and in 1917 the college was finally chartered by the State of North Carolina as a teacher's school.

The original name of the school was the "Montre at Normal School" but was morganized in 1934 as "Montreat C o 1 l e g e." The school was accredited at this time as a high school and a junior college with one year of teacher training. In 1933 there were 30 college students and 50 high s c h o o l students. Within eleven years the school became a full fouryear college.

The women of Montreat College led a gay but lonely life until 1957 when the school became officially coeducational. Those first brave gentlemen were outnumbered 128 to 5. In the 1957 Sun Dial, one of these young. men commented, "It's been an interesting year." A second male student commented that that was the understatement of the decade.

In 1959 Montreat College be came Montreat-Anderson college, a two-year, co-educationsl liberal arts school. This school has been kept in step with modern educational concepts and new provides an education to over 400 students.

wonder what those Montreat


