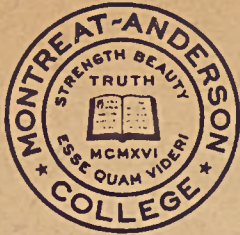

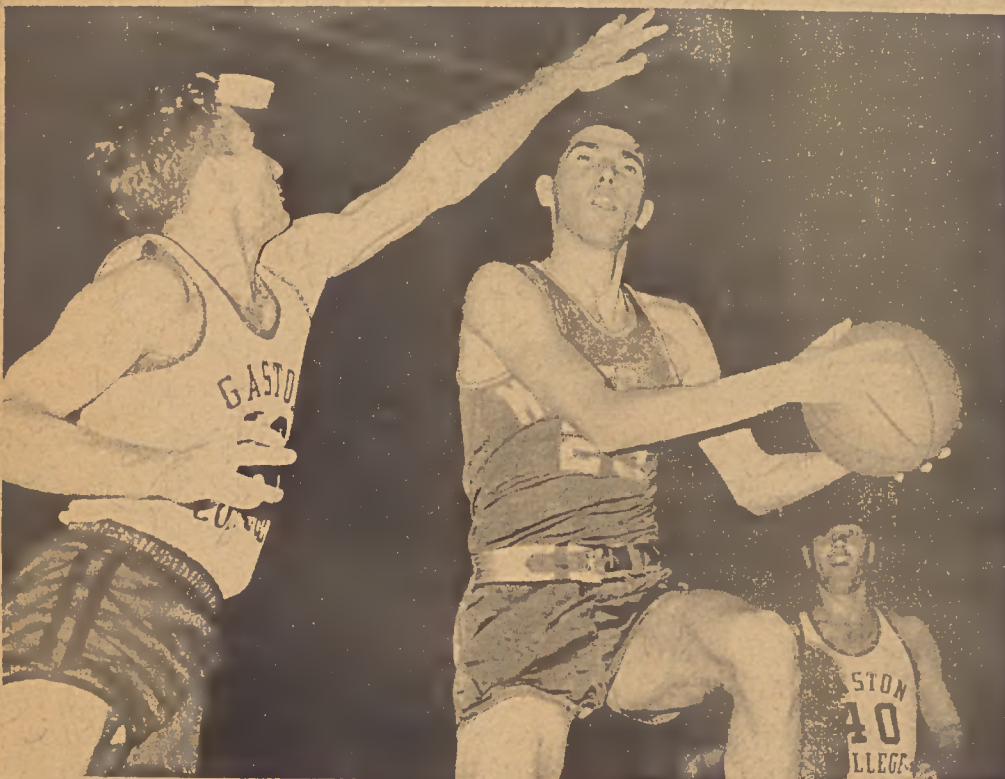

The Cavaliers broke an eight - game losing streak on Tuesday night, February 1, as they defeated Gaston College 63-59. The win avenged an earlier loss to Gaston.

Montreat's record is now 3-10. The Cavaliers need one more win to tie the record for the most victories in one season and two wins to break the record.

Don Patrick got the Cavaliers off and running as he put Montreat on the scoreboard first. Increasing their lead to 6-0 it looked as though the Cavaliers would have no trouble with Gaston. Then as has happened so many times during the season, the Cavaliers grew cold. Gaston quickly took the lead and went into the dressing room, at the half, leading 27-21.

Falling behind by as much as nine points it looked as though Montreat would go down to their ninth straight defeat. Not giving up, the Cavaliers fought their way back and with just under six minutes left to play, Linwood Ornduff sank two free throws to tie the score at 48-all.
