munity and to the students of MAC and believes a radical change is beginning to take place here. "I have a witness that the Holy Spirit has a very definite plan for this campus and community, and the prayers of the older saints here have certainly not gone unnoticed. I believe, however, that the same Holy Spirit is waiting for a much deeper commitment from myself and the younger believers before answering these aforementioned prayers. As a reference, 1 direct my attention to the promise of 11 Chronicles 7:14 ("If my people which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.")."

David was born in Victoria, Texas of Christian parents. His grandfather was a well-known Christian radio minister, from whom David received the bulk of Christian training. His grandfather died when David was twelve years old, "and my spiritual advancement terminated at about the same time. My parents, though Christian people, were more or less persuaded that the individual must find his own way in this area of life; and I determined to adopt this principle not only in my spiritual training, but ultimately in every as-pect of my life scheme in total-

Ity."

David's life took an erratic course for several years after this, beginning with him dropping out of high school and travelling to Europe to live as a card shark or gambler. "Living by a deck of cards, I ultimately came to learn a lesson which I would impart to any individual engaged in this somewhat dubious art of support. The lesson is that you do not control the cards. On the con trary, it is they who control you. I left the life of self-styled gambler and same away quite empty." From here, David searched for peace of mind in transcendental meditation; he found it lacking. He returned to the U.S. and became involved with Joe Bonanno, one of the five New York Dons of La Costra Nostra, or the Mafia. "For two years I lived with this man and was to be his constant companion. Our relationship was very much that of master teacher and student. From him I was to learn of human nature and behavior from a unique point of view. It was through knowing this man that I was to come to know of another phenomenon that very definitely exists in this universe, and the Bible says it in the clearest sense, 'What towest thou so shalt thou reap.'"

From his life with Joe Bonanno, David went to the drug world,
still searching for peace of mind.
There is in addition to the natural world..... a supernatural
world separated from us by only
the filmiest of veils. A world as
limitless as time and space and
governed by beings which cannot
be seen by the natural eye and
yet remain quite as real as you
and I. But, peace of mind, which
we must remember, remains the ultimate goal which will never be
found in this place."

con't from page 1 communion tokens in the world. Containing two volumes 40 years aga, the Historical Foundation now totals 4,600 volumes, includin~ family geneologies and church histories. Many people enjoy looking up the record of their ancestors or their own baptisms in these volumes. The Historical Foundation has an average of 10,000 vistors per year, with a record of 200 on certain days in the summer. High school students come from as far as Charlotte to do research pa ers, and one man even came from Dublin, Ireland to work on his Ph.D. Aside from the volumes, there are also personal papers from many presbyterian ministers and dissionaries, shedding light on conditions in their own times and places. Records are also kept of important meetings, such as the minutes of the General Assembly meetings. Last, but certainly not least for Montreat students, the Historical Foundation does employ students for part-time work, and will have probable openings for the summer.
