Last summer, twenty-three cyclists traveled six southern states, 1800 miles, witnessing for Christ.

Citing that the greatest benefit of the trip was the spiritual growth, rather than the physical feat, Mr. Massey said, "On a long bicycle trip, you have a lot of time to think."

In a recent interview Mr. Massey commented on the phenomenal growth of cycling in recent years. Reflecting that Montreat has not been unscathed by the "bicycle boom", he said, "There are more bicycles on campus this year than ever."

Consequently, numerous spring-time activities are planned for enthusiasts. There will be one-day and weekend trips to places like Mt. Mitchell and Mt. Coming highlights in pedaling include a June trip to Europe, and a July trip in North Carolina. Both trips will be co-ed, and will last approximately three weeks.
