A Letter from Tony Campolo

Students of Montreat:

I appreciated the good reception that you gave to me during my brief visit to your campus as I delivered the Staley Lecture Series of 1984.

Your student body is exciting and alive. The spirit of God is moving in your midst.

I am anxious to share with you some opportunities if you are interested in pursuing a career in missionary service. First of all, you might contact Intercristo. This organization provides a computer service whereby your background, interests, aptitudes, and abilities are matched up with the needs of mission stations around the world. In a scientific way, you can learn almost every missionary option available to you. This service requires a small fee, but it is well worth it. You will be sent a print-out of hundreds of missoinary opportunities that would fit your

needs and calling. you can write to intercristo at: 19303 Freemont Avenue, Seattle, WA 98133. You can also call them toll free: 1-800-426-1343.

The second option is to contact the Mennonite Central Committee, 21 South 12th Street, Akron, PA 17501. This organization is interested in volunteer workers who are willing to go into a service vocation for a two-year period. The Mennonite Central Committee will pay all of your traveling expenses, living expenses, and provide you with a very small stipend. You can try out being a missionary for two years without any costs. You can work on a field that challenges your interest and discover if missionary work is your calling. A similar opportunity for volunteer work is provided by the General Conference of the Mennonite Church, Box 347, Newton, KS 67114.

Needless to say, I would love for you to pursue your education by coming to Eastern College, St. David's, PA 19087. I would love to have you study in our Sociology department. We have programs in youth ministries and in missions that would provide fantastic background for service, both overseas and here on the homefront. If you want to know more about Eastern and the way in which we are attempting to carry out the missionary imperative and the ways in which we are training people for youth ministries here in the United States just drop me a line. i am most anxious to correspond with you.
