One may at first be struck by the tiny size of Black Mountain's TongSing restaurant; they may also be surprised at the small size of the bill total. Despite the smallness of these aspects, they do not equal the taste: Big and Good! Owners T.C. and Sara Chhay opened TongSing two years ago, and have since opened another sister restaurant in the Chimney Rock area. Success of this restaurant is the logical outcome of several factors. First, the service is good and friendly. The food is wonderful and the selection is very large. The prices are reasonable, averaging from \$4.39 to approximately \$8.99.
