Montreat Loses a Good Friend

Dr. Jack Crawford, a good friend and Professor Emeritus of the college, passed away Saturday, November 24, at age

69, after a brief struggle with cancer. He worked for the college from 1970 until his retirement in 1997. He served as Chair of the History Department, professor of history, and even as director of admissions in

Dr. King, Dr. Risher, and vice president Jac Whatley all reported that Crawford had a reputation for

being both a challenging teacher and a friendly, gregarious person. "He probably never knew a stranger," commented Don King.

Many people remember him as always caring for his students, and even keeping in touch with many after they graduated.

Jac Watley said Dr. Crawford was always finding financial donors for the college, and inventing new ways to save

money. He reported Crawford as being "an interesting combination of someone who was very frugal and very generous at the same time. ... He always thought of the college before he thought of himself."

Before coming to Montreat, Crawford spent nine years as a missionary for the Presbyterian Church, (US) in Zaire, working in theological education. He was Professor of Church History, Vice-Dean, and Faculty of Theology at Free University of Congo during his time in Africa.

Dr. Jack Crawford's heart for people, teaching, and service remains a fond memory at Montreat College, and he will certainly be missed. His local memorial service was held Saturday, December 1, in Gaither Chapel.
