March 14 around 4:45am an esti-

mated 154 gallons of hot water rushed into Anderson room 203.

In a "fluke accident," according to Facilities Director Alan Edwards, the half inch PVC pipe

that feeds the hot water directly into RA Johanna Gledhill's sink made a complete break. According to Mr. Edwards there was a "maximum flow in Anderson for at least 20 minutes." The water at full flow has been estimated to be a rate of 1 gallon every 7.8 seconds. At this speed an estimated 3 bathtubs dumped onto the second floor. Mr. Edwards explains the break as the result of the PVC expanding and contracting where it connects with the metal. He went on to express that "when you have a pressurized system things are going to break."

In room 203 the hot water level rose to two inches and meandered into other rooms on the hall. Johanna walking through this water explained, "My feet were ok." The water also flowed down to the first floor soaking much of RD Kathy Wince's Apartment. Damages so far are estimated at over \$1,000.

Eventually the fire alarms went off displacing all of the Anderson ladies to the Belk Lobby for about 45 minutes.

In the wake of the flood into his apartment Ernest Wince has expressed "My wife and I would like to thank God for his blessings and watchful care over us, and a special thanks to the Anderson RAs and those who helped get us back

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According to Johanna the pipe that broke was a new plastic pipe that was installed three weeks before the break to fix a leak under her sink. A maintenance staffer informed her after the break, that the new pipe was the right pipe for the job. In a completely unrelated inci-

dent, at about the same time, a

water pipe in Davis also broke. This breakage was a crack in a recirculation pipe between the bathroom and cleaning closet on the first floor. This was a case of piping from 1964 giving out. Due to the timing of the two events Mr. Edwards checked with the City of Black Mountain and examined the breaks and determined that they were not related.
