Student Smashed by Drunk Driver

Montreat student Josh Williams was hit by a drunk driver on his way to Andrews Geysers, Friday, April 5.

At 3:50 PM, Josh came to a part of the road that crosses under a railroad trestle. According to Josh "it narrows down to about a lane and a half... You're supposed to slow down, look and honk your horn. I slowed down, honked my horn and saw a car coming at me in my lane."

According to the police report, the driver, Robert Waters, was traveling at 35 miles per hour as he slammed his Chevy Blazer into Josh's Volvo Wagon.

Josh, Trent Lucas, Tarbell Patton, and Noah Swaty were traveling to

Parkway. Tarbell and Trent were already at the geysers 100 yards away, with Noah following Josh when the wreck happened.

After Mr. Waters smashed into Josh he swerved between Josh and Noah and crashed into a ditch on the side of the road. Josh suffered only relatively mild injuries on his left side with a banged up knee, elbow and head. The door was too smashed to use so he had to exit the vehicle through the sunroof.

Mr. Waters, however, had to be removed from his vehicle by paramedics and was hospitalized. Water's two passengers walked away from the car without assistance.

Later, when Williams went to remove his items from the car at Trading Samuel's Friday Towing Service, the attendant commented, "Man, the Lord was riding with you."
