

# FROM THE EDITOR

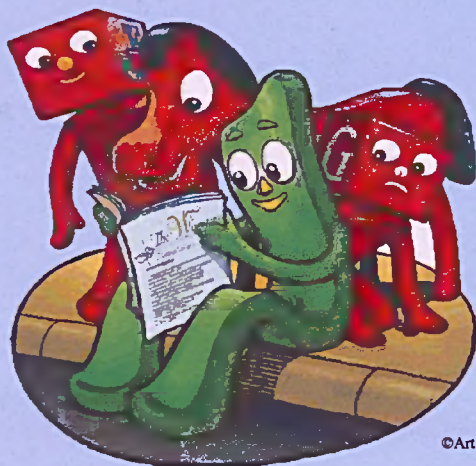
Hello everyone,
