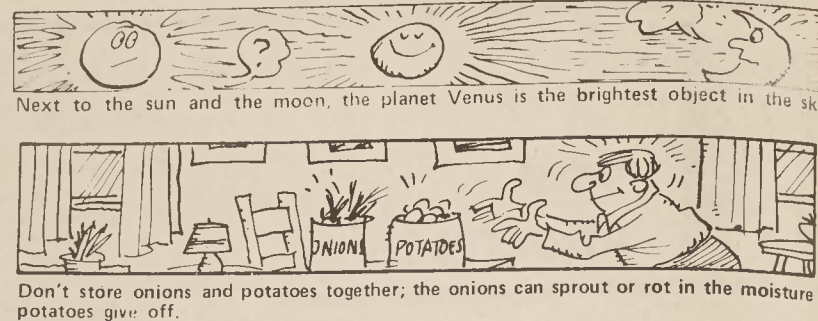
Gerry Andre was ring bearer.
