## Local Killed At Forest City

Gordon Atkins Jr., 51, of North Main Street, Boiling Springs, died of gunshot wounds 8:30 p.m. Friday at Rutherford Hospital.

Atkins was shot in a domestic quarrel at a Florence Street house in Forest City. Police were planning Tuesday to bring charges against Myron Ritchie Tessenner, a Forest City man, in the shooting.

A native of Cleveland County, Atkins was a self-employed logger and a Korean War veteran. He was buried Monday at Ganatt's Grove Baptist Church Cemetery. Atkins is survived by his parents, Gordon Atkins of Mooresboro and Carrie Willis Atkins of New Cumberland, Pa., four sons, and two daughters; a brother, and one grandchild.
