What's the latest on bee-sting remedies? - M.P. The best remedy for relief from bee-sting pain is aspirin and water, rubbed right onto the sting. An immediate soothing effect occurs from evaporative cooling, and inflammation is reduced from local absorption of aspirin at the sting site. For best results, rub a paste made from a crushed aspirin tablet and a little water

Is there any chance that heroin will become a legal treatment for those with terminal illness? - J.M.

Possibly. A double-blind trial of heroin versus morphine was recently completed in 48 cancer patients who had moderate, severe pain. The patients rated heroin 21/2 times more potent than morphine when the secret code was broken at the end of the study. The doctors also noted that morphine and heroin had the


My son has epilepsy and has been taking medication for over five years. His doctor says that he can expect to stay on the medication for the rest of his life. Is there no alternative? - C.D.


