New Bridge At Whittaker Road

Massive bridge supports inch their way across the Sandy Run Creek as construction continues on state road 1164 linking Mooresboro to Boiling Springs.

The new, two-lane bridge costs \$218,000 and is scheduled for completion in December; it replaces a one-lane bridge there dating from the early '30's.

The old bridge had been judged unsafe by the Department of Transportation, and school buses were not allowed to pass it. It was torn out of the creek in April.

The unpaved state road, also named Whittaker Road after the late Ed Whittaker, intersects North Main Street at the rescue squad building in Boiling Springs.
