

# A Lightning Bolt, And Then —



A surge of lightning along an electric circuit is believed to have started this fire at the Burks Road Rug Mill during a rainstorm Sunday afternoon, Shanghai fire chief Dennis Hamrick said Tuesday.

Shanghai was one of four fire departments answering the call. No one was hurt, but poisonous smoke from burning yarn polyester forced firemen to don air packs and gas masks.

### Test Time For Bulls

#### Honeyhaven Sale Site

It's quite a test: questions on birth weight, feed efficiency, weaning weight, and fertility.

Purebred and commercial livestock breeders will be taking a close look at answers to these and other questions at the third annual Cleveland County Bull Evaluation Center. The center will begin testing senior bulls Saturday, August 7.

Information on each bull that is put on test is recorded for the use of producers and buyers. With fertility test results on bulls, the buyer knows that a calf crop will not be lost at the expense of the bull.

The test will be 140 days long, followed by a sale. Both the test and sale will be conducted at Honeyhaven Farms owned by Marvin Hamrick. Honeyhaven is located in the Flint Hill community.

In other farming news:

county extension agents warn cotton and soybean farmers to look out for a destructive insect that begins to pest Cleveland County between mid-late July: the corn earworm. In cotton the insect is called the bollworm. Extension agents warn that this is the time of year the earworms begin to emerge from corn.
