### SALMON SAUTE WITH FRESH VEGETABLES

- 4 (4 to 6 oz. each) fresh/frozen Alaska salmon steaks, thawed if necessary
- 1/4 teaspoon thyme, crushed
- 1/4 cup water
- Salt and pepper
- 1 1/2 cups diagonally sliced asparagus or zucchini
- 1 teaspoon grated lemon peel
- Oil
- 1 1/2 cups sliced fresh mushrooms
- Lemon slices
- 1/2 cup chopped green onion
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Season salmon with salt and pepper. Sauté in 1/4 cup hot oil until browned on both sides. Allow 10 minutes cooking time per inch of thickness measured at its thickest part. In separate skillet, heat 2 tablespoons oil. Add green onion, salt and thyme; sauté 30 seconds. Add asparagus, mushrooms, water and lemon peel; cover and simmer 2 minutes or until vegetables are crisp-tender. Remove to serving plate with slotted spoon. Garnish with lemon slices. Makes 4 servings.

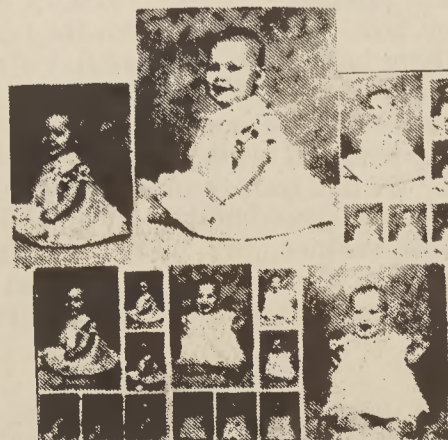
