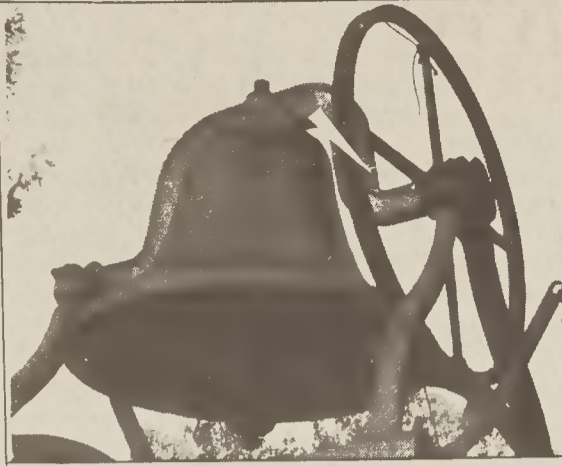

Mr. and Mrs. Mason Scruggs visited Mrs. Daisy Phillips in Spartanburg on Thursday.

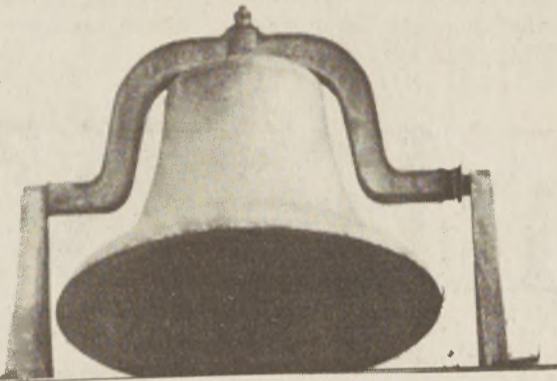
