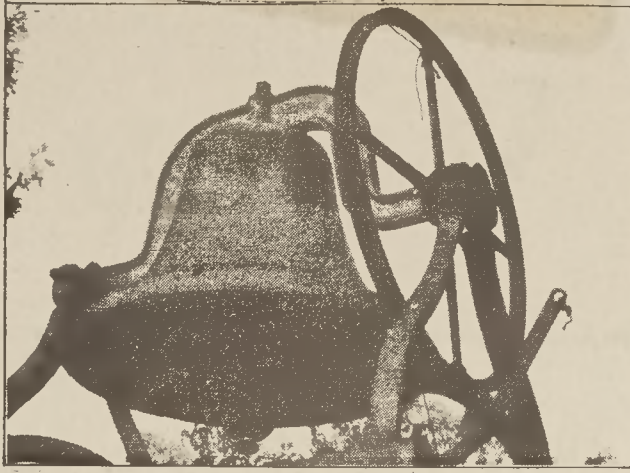


## Mt. Pleasant
